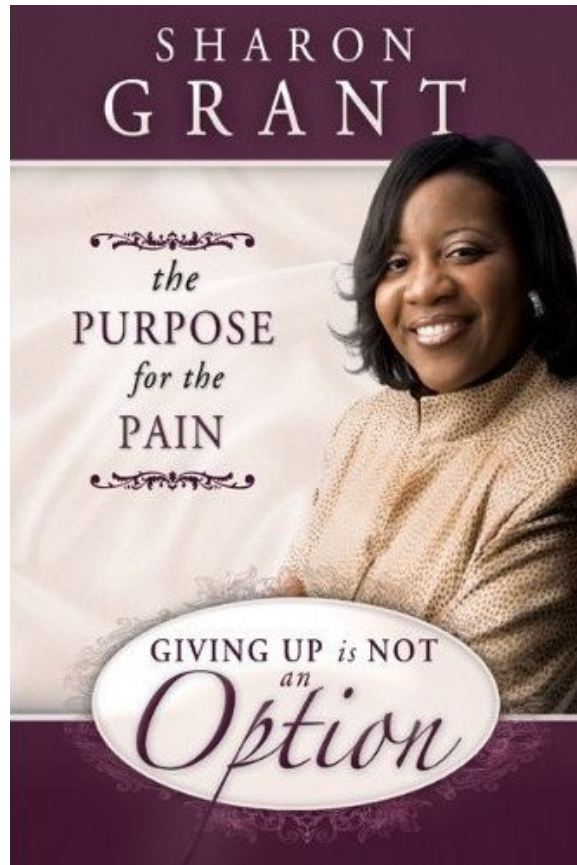

Walk by Faith, Not by Sight

I was on a missionary journey early this year assisting a local Church. I started there the first Sunday of this year. I was truly enjoying the service one day and wanted to make sure I took some good notes. As I looked up, this lady was starring at me. I smiled at her, but she turned to me and said, "If you don't want to be here, you can leave." She immediately turned towards the pulpit and began to clap her hands and said, "I got your back pastor." Little did I know the battle was on. (NOTE: Demons are not omnipresent, but they have territories. What came in my spirit, at this time, was I was invading that demons territory. That demonic spirit did not want me there, so I immediately started pleading the "Blood of Jesus.")

The Pastor was new, so there were a lot of first time activities/ministries. The 4th Sunday was established as "Youth Sunday." So for the first youth Sunday, we had a praise dancer. As she began to dance ("YES" by Shekinah Glory), the recorder kept stopping. We discovered that the recorder was old, so we scheduled the dancer to come the next 4th Sunday and purchased a new recorder. The 4th Sunday, in February, the dancer came back and was dancing to the same song again. This time the entire outlet the recorder was plugged into blew out. At this time, the pastor said, "It's a spiritual warfare." After service, I said to him that I knew this was true, because I had been attacked in my back. Around mid-February, I had begun to experience severe back problems. About a week prior to my back bothering me, God placed in my spirit, "Walk by Faith, Not by Sight." I remember saying to God, "Why do you keep telling me this?" On March 11th, I was hospitalized, after falling twice at my doctor's office; the first time outside of her office and the second time inside her office. I was transported, by ambulance to Doctor's Hospital, because my pressure was so high. My doctor wasn't sure at that time, if I was having a stroke or what. I took a series of tests and was diagnosed with 2 severely herniated disks, which were pressing down on the sciatic nerve. I was in pain like never before and could barely walk. I had to lift my leg with my hand, to get in and out of the car and up the stairs. I felt like I was carrying around dead weight. I was so drained -- no energy at all.

When the orthopedic surgeon visited me to tell me that I needed surgery, I looked at him and immediately said, "Do you know who my Daddy is?" He replied, "Yes, we have the same Daddy." I then said, "You better act like we do, so what is the alternative?" He then said, "I can give you a series of steroids, for 6 days. It will not fix the problem, but they will make you feel better." I was already going to physical therapy (PT), so I said to him, "That is all I need, so that I can continue my PT."

It was at this point, that God began to reveal to me what He meant by "Walk by Faith, Not by Sight" and when I was told if I did not want to be at the church that I could leave, I knew I was in the middle of a "war zone." I had been hit by a fiery dot; knocked down twice, but got back up because God was with me. He was telling me that no matter how things looked or what people said, that I was to trust Him. He then gave me 1 Peter 4:12-19: "Beloved, think it not strange concerning the fiery trial which is to try you, as though some strange thing happened unto you: But rejoice, inasmuch as ye are partakers of Christ's sufferings; that, when his glory shall be revealed, ye may be glad also with exceeding joy. If ye be reproached for the name of Christ, happy are ye; for the spirit of glory and of God resteth upon you: on their part he is evil spoken of, but on your part he is glorified. But let none of you suffer as a murderer, or as a thief, or as an evildoer, or as a busybody in other men's matters. Yet if any man suffer as a Christian, let him not be ashamed; but let him glorify God on this behalf. For the time is come that judgment must begin at the house of God: and if it first begin at us, what shall the end be of them that obey not the gospel of God? And if the righteous scarcely be saved, where shall the ungodly and the sinner appear? Wherefore let them that suffer according to the will of God commit the keeping of their souls to him in well doing, as unto a faithful Creator.

Now this blew my mind because I was truly at the beginning of my "Faith Walk." I told God that I was willing to take this "Faith Walk," for Him, for you see, the battle is not ours, but the Lord's. Everything that we do is to bring Him glory. It's all about HIM. I knew that God would never fail me and anything and everything that He allowed was for my good and He is to get the glory. So here I am, on this journey not really knowing what God is doing or where He is taking me, but one thing I did know and that is I had to trust HIM, even as far as going on a cruise that I had paid for, prior to this happening. Some looked at me wondering how in the world could I go on a cruise walking with a walker, in pain, bent over. Well, God was healing me prior to the cruise, but the cruise was a big turning point, for me. I went on the cruise trusting God and He did not fail me. I had a great time. I called the cruise my "Spiritual Encounter." I took some yoga classes and had a spa detox. God showed up, out and off - my healing was really beginning. I had gone to my Orthopedic, prior to the cruise and he said to me, "although I see some progress, I still recommend surgery." I said to him "OK, but I am going on a cruise and will see you when I get back." When I got back, I continued to go to PT, do yoga and detox. I went to my Orthopedic on Thursday, 16 July. He looked at my new set of x-rays and said to me that the MRI shows that I am still a candidate for surgery, but my strength level shows something different. He said, "I don't know what to say." He said, "Well, I could not convince you to do the surgery before and now since you are getting stronger, I know I can't convince you to do it and I am not going to argue

with you...I am just amazed. What ever you are doing, continue it and I will see you in six weeks." All I could say to him is, "It is GOD." To top this, Tuesday, 14 July, the Physical Therapist told me that he was not really doing anything to treat the back because my Orthopedic told him to not to touch it. The traction, which would help the back, I was not able to do. He said that all he is doing is giving me a treatment that helps to keep the pain down and treatment for strengthening my leg/hip muscle. He said that he is really amazed as to how strong my back is getting. The bottom line is God is glorified when we trust HIM and when He is glorified, He will fulfill every promise He has made to us. God is faithful and He is still all powerful, all knowing and yes He still heals. Can GOD, Oh yes He can and He does it in a way where only He and He only can/will get the glory, for He will not share His glory with anyone. My prayer is that someone's faith will be strengthened in knowing that the God that we serve is able to do all things. Whatever it is that you are going through keep the faith and please don't give up. Your blessing is closer than you think. Continue to walk by faith, and not by sight.

Be Still And Know...

2009 was a rough year for a lot of people. The economy continued to have its effects on every household and it proved to be trying times financially for a lot of us who are reading this newsletter. I am so thankful for the arrival of 2010 and the feeling of a fresh new start so that we can all enjoy what God has in store for us in the coming year. In early 2009 I found that I was pregnant with my second son. He was to be born in October and his name was Kaleb. The pregnancy was tough. I was diagnosed with gestational diabetes, high blood pressure and because of my weight and overall health, was considered "high risk" for other illnesses during pregnancy and was being closely monitored by an endocrinologist, my obstetrician and a High-Risk medical team. I was taking insulin injections multiple times a day and even moved in with my parents for a month this summer to get extra help with my six year old son so I could maintain my medicine schedules. My doctors made it very clear that despite the rigorous schedule of medicines and doctor appointments, that it was vital for the survival of me and my unborn child.

I was seeing my high-risk maternity doctor twice a week in the latter part of my pregnancy and during a routine visit on September 17 at 35 weeks, was informed that my son no longer had a heartbeat. I was devastated to say the least. I had carried this child for eight months. I struggled through all the medical issues that I was going through. Struggled through the schedules of 3-4 doctor appointments a week, waking up extra early during the day to start the days off with the necessary meds, eating food that I absolutely hated, made preparations at home for a new baby and my baby had passed away. My initial thoughts were that I had done something to cause his death. Maybe it was that piece of cheesecake that I had snuck the night before or that time that I went to McDonalds for a burger and thought "this little sandwich won't make a difference".

That day, I delivered by cesarean section. During delivery we learned that Kaleb's nutrients had been cut off by the umbilical cord and that it was wrapped around his neck three times. My family was there and the doctors allowed us time to grieve with the baby. It was a time with my child that I will never get back, but I cherish every moment of it so much. I was told by several people close to me, that I was so strong. I was told that if it had happened to them, they would have not been able to hold themselves together like I did. I was also told that they were impressed with the way that I handled the situation. Impressed? It was nothing but God. You never know how you will feel in a situation, unless it happens to you. But you should know how you will perform in a situation if God is truly the head of your life and orders your steps. This *entire year* I endured a hard pregnancy, a difficult delivery and grief...and I am still grieving.

But why am I telling you this? "ALL things work together for good for those who love God, Who are called according to his purpose" (Romans 8:28). Paul doesn't promise that only good or pleasurable things will happen to the Christian. But what he does say is that even the difficult experiences can be used in God's overall plan for good. I truly believe that this situation was in God's will and that by my openness to share it with you, will give you a renewed hope and spirit for the coming year. God knows what he is doing and I find comfort and solace in that. You may have lost someone close to you this year, may have lost your job, may have lost your home...whatever you have lost or endured, just be still and know that He is God and God alone and he will deliver you from your situation. Enter into the New Year with joy and thanksgiving on your heart for seeing another year and you will reap the blessings that He has in store for you.
